Dong-Gun Lee is Professor at the Div. of Infectious Diseases, Dept. of Internal Medicine, College of Medicine, The Catholic University of Korea, and the Director of Transplantation & Consultation Center, Catholic Hematology Hospital, Seoul, Korea. Prof. Lee obtained his MD and PhD degrees from the Catholic University of Korea, Seoul, Korea and trained post-doc at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in Madison, WI, USA from



2006 to 2008. His major research interests include the diagnosis and management of infectious complications from hematological malignancy patients, especially focus on resistant bacteria, invasive fungal infections, herpes viruses, respiratory viral infections, and prevention of infectious diseases such as post-transplantation vaccination. He has widely published on this topic and has received multiple competitive research grants through the Korea Health Industry Development Institution, KFDA, and National Evidence-based Health Care Collaborating Agency. He is also actively involved in many clinical trials of management and prevention of invasive fungal and viral infections. Prof. Lee is an active member of many medical societies including The Korean Society of Infectious Diseases, Korean Society for Antimicrobial Chemotherapy, and The Korean Society of Blood and Marrow Transplantation. He also works as an editor-in-chief of *Infection & Chemotherapy*.
